### Palácio Príncipe Real—the Best Hotel in Lisbon

#### Location

Right in the heart of one of Lisbon's loveliest districts, where faded palaces mix with buzzing restaurants and concept stores overlook palm-filled parks. Lisbon airport is a 20-minute drive away.

#### Service and Facilities

Whether you want to ride a horse along a beach at sunset or taste wines, all can be organised. There is a small spa with two treatment rooms offering massages(按摩) and facials, yoga in the mornings and a heated swimming pool in the garden.

#### Rooms

Some have showers; others have freestanding bathtubs. Some are simply decorated, and others are luxurious(奢华的). But all have a view over the wonderful gardens. Beds are covered

with soft cottons, and bathrooms in local limestone(石灰岩) come with heated floors. There are coffee machines, scented candles to light up your bath time and free mini bars with health shots and, what always seems to be missing from hotels, fresh milk for your morning coffee.

### Food and Drink

There are well done, simple food drawing on the best ingredients that Portugal has, from the smoked hams to the local cheeses and the freshest catch of the day from the market. Breakfast is à la carte with options such as avocado toast and poached eggs. The Duck Bar, so called after the hotel logo of an Indian runner duck, serves a wide range of Portuguese wines.

### Value for Money

Doubles in low season from £457, including breakfast. Doubles in high season from £573, including breakfast. Free Wi-Fi.

There is one room that is suitable for wheelchair users, which makes Palácio Príncipe Real stand out.

The school year was almost over, and we'd be moving on to a new school for sixth grade. All the girls made autograph books and collected signatures. As I signed my classmates' books, I noticed their moms had written in them, too. Such sweet thoughts were expressed: "I couldn't be prouder of you." "I love you. Dad and I are so proud of you."

I asked my mother to sign mine, too. She was busy, she said, but she'd get to it later. I set the book on the kitchen table. Later that night, she handed it back to me. I was anxious to see what encouraging words she had written.

This is what I found on the page:

*When a thing is first begun,  
Never leave it till it's done.  
Be the labor great or small,  
Do it well or not at all.*

Mom

No words of pride or encouragement. It was just a stupid poem—another indication to me that, if I couldn't be perfect, I wasn't good enough. I held back my tears, not expressing how I felt.

That page in that handmade book plagued me for years. In the following years, I battled perfectionism and low self-esteem and never felt good enough for most of my life.

When my mother was in her eighties and in a nursing home, I gave her a book to fill out so we could know more about her. It had tips at the top of each page and then blank space to

respond. Sadly, my mother passed away soon.

After she died, I sorted out her belongings. The one thing I wanted more than anything was that book. I found it and immediately read through it, and I saw she had just filled out ten pages. But ten pages of memories were better than no pages.

What I found stopped me short. On page ten, the tip asked, "What's the best advice you got from your mom and dad?" Her response was what she had written in my autograph book. I've come to see that Mom was passing on something she found valuable in her life. A gift from her to me.

### C

Farming today not only sends out greenhouse-gas but destroys wildlife habitats. Agriculture now takes up half of Earth's hospitable land surface, at the expense of these habitats. So I hope to restore current farmland to its natural state by ending the vegetation(植被) stage of crop-growing.

My PhD research at Wageningen University in the Netherlands is inspired by alternative, indoor methods of food production, such as farming leafy green vegetables vertically(垂直地) and growing meat in a laboratory. I wondered—if you can grow meat without an animal, can you grow fruit without a plant? This could be done inside, which might help us to return some agricultural land to nature.

During my master's programme in agricultural engineering, I discussed indoor fruit production with my professor. He eagerly invited me to write a master's paper on the subject of growing fruits without the plant.

The main task of my PhD is to collect immature fruit or flowers from tomato plants, and try to grow the stems(茎) into healthy, high-quality tomatoes in the lab. Ultimately, we want to produce fruit from tomato undifferentiated cells from which new plant organs can grow—and skip using a plant entirely.

I had achieved some early results of my research, when I was testing different growing conditions at different stages of tomato development. The lighting is an energy-efficiency measure; we use blue and red LEDs, the best colours for photosynthesis.

Some people get excited about the possibilities of my work, but most are doubtful, which I understand. In the past, people have rushed into using food technologies, such as cage-grown chickens and the extensive use of fertilizer, without considering the potential downsides. An important part of my PhD programme will be to assess the sustainability of my method.

D

You can get a clear picture about *Deep Work* by Cal Newport in 5 minutes. *Deep Work* tells us professional activities performed in a state of distraction-free concentration that push your cognitive(认知的) capabilities to their limit. These efforts create new value and improve your skill. The ability to perform deep work is becoming increasingly rare at exactly the same time it is becoming increasingly valuable in our economy. As a consequence, the few who develop the skill, and then make it the core of their working life, will thrive(蓬勃发展).

The book tells us the core abilities for thriving in the new economy, which are the ability to quickly master hard things, the ability to produce a high level, in terms of both quality and speed. If you can't learn, you can't thrive. If you don't produce, you won't thrive—no matter how skilled or talented you are. If you haven't mastered deep work, you'll struggle to learn hard things. To learn hard things quickly, you must focus intensely without distraction.

The key to developing a deep work habit is to move beyond good intentions and add routines and habits to your working life designed to minimize a state of unbroken concentration. To master the art of deep work, therefore, you must take back control of your time and attention from the many entertainments on the Internet that attempt to steal them. Adopt a tool only if its positive impacts on these factors substantially outweigh its negative impacts. It's crucial that you figure out in advance what you're going to do with your evenings and weekends before they begin.

In the end of *Deep Work*, we can know that the ability to concentrate is a skill that gets valuable things done. If you're struggling to use your mind to its fullest capacity to create things that matter, then you'll discover, as others have before you, that depth generates a life rich with productivity and meaning.

A water system from more than 3,600 years ago 56 (discover) in Central China's Henan province so far. This find will improve people's understanding of the city design back then. According to local archaeologists(考古学家), one of the sections was built on a natural river channel, while the remaining two 57 (be) entirely artificial. About 540 meters of ditches(沟) were unearthed, with a 58 (wide) of about 12 meters at the widest point, and a depth of roughly four meters at 59 (it) deepest point. Ruins of the city covered about 25 square kilometers, and it is believed to be a former Shang capital 60 (construct) by Emperor Tang, the first emperor of the Shang Dynasty.

In one of the ditch sections, archaeologists found artificial open channels and stone facilities for water diversion, 61 (indicate) that in the early Shang Dynasty, there had already been complex functional design of the water system. 62 (remain) of handicraft workshops for copper(铜) casting and making bone objects were also found. The ditches were connected with ponds and gardens in the northern parts of the city, 63 means that water in the system supplied not only production and life in the city, but was also used for landscaping of the city.

Discovery of this water system enhanced our understanding of 64 layout of the ancient city, which is 65 great significance for in-depth study of city planning and functional zones division in the early Shang Dynasty capital.
