“If you treat someone with a little kindness,” Oliver said, “it can make you feel better knowing that someone else feels better.”

The capabilities and arrival of virtual reality headsets have become mainstream and available to most people. Virtual reality has now become an extremely useful tool for education, careers, and just for fun.

VR has helped make improvement in the professions that put people in danger. For example, it enables firefighters to learn and experience things that they would only have learned if they were actually in a real fire situation. VR allows people like firefighters and even doctors to participate in a similar environment that they would be working in and make mistakes. By allowing them to make mistakes without serious consequences and learn from those mistakes, a trainee can more quickly catch up in their field.

Many schools have also started to use VR to help young kids with their learning. For example, for language learners, the practice is very helpful in the process of learning. With VR, students who are learning Chinese can visit historical locations like Pingyao or Qufu in a virtual world and be immersed in Chinese culture. They would quickly pick up the language. And they will be more likely to remember and make a connection with what they learned by visiting the places as opposed to just simply reading about those places in textbook.

Not only does VR help people train and practice for professional careers but it can also help people psychologically. For instance, if someone feels very uncomfortable or anxious when they are in small or enclosed places, VR can put them in a similar situation and slowly get the person used to being in such an environment. Or instead of practicing in front of your mom in the kitchen, you can instead practice in an environment made to look like an office and talk to either a real person that isn't your mom or an AI that's programmed to ask you interview questions.

Although many people use VR mostly for fun like video games. I think businesses, schools, and medical practices should make use of VR in their establishments. This is because the benefits of being immersed in an environment and being able to make mistakes, make memorable learning connections, and helping people conquer their anxieties can go a long way in helping society become better as a whole.

Watching wildlife safely is the responsibility of all park visitors. When you visit some national parks, you are entering animals' habitat. 29 If not, wildlife may face the following serious risks when you get close enough to interact with them:

Consequences of Physical Contact with People

Some animals, from bison to birds, may be rejected by their parents if they have contact with humans. 30 In addition, wildlife can get injured when they try to escape people who have gotten too close, especially if they are near human structures or roads.

Fatal Diseases from People and Pets

Our domestic pets can also pose real dangers to the wildlife within parks. Both pets and people may have diseases that they can give to wildlife. Sadly, there are many examples of wildlife in parks dying from diseases given to them by pets and humans. For example, heartworm from cats can kill wildlife such as foxes, coyotes, bobcats, and mountain lions. Black-footed ferrets die from the flu if humans are sick and get too close. 31 So keeping your pets vaccinated can keep them and wildlife safe.

Dangers of Eating Human Food and/or Trash（垃圾）

When visitors intentionally or unintentionally feed wildlife, it has negative effects on the wildlife. Some of the dangers to wildlife include shorter lives. The best way for wildlife to have a healthy diet and live healthy lives is to search for food as they would naturally. Relying on human food or trash left out puts wildlife at risk.

32 Animals becoming used to and attracted to human food will actively seek out human food. This in the worst cases can make them dangerous. Ground squirrels can bite, deer have sharp antlers（鹿角），and bears can get into cars or tents in search of food. 33 It means they may be killed by park managers for safety reasons.

But evidence suggests that hobbies such as Kelly's satisfy more than just the stomach. Research has linked participation in leisure activities to many measures of physical and mental well-being, from reduced blood pressure to a sense of belonging. We need to see hobbies and work as win-win games.

Carving out free time can be challenging, but there are strategies for success. Jingmei Li, a cancer researcher from Singapore, uses most of her holiday time for driving trips. Jennifer Hertzberg, a psychologist at the University of California, tries to keep the weekends free for her hobby, building Legos.

Many scientists like them have found that hobbies offer them a break from the stress of doing science. Everyone—including scientists—can get stuck in ways of thinking that prevent them from finding a solution to a problem, no matter how hard they work. Evidence suggests that taking a break or doing something different can help improve problem-solving, by revealing a new approach or an overlooked detail. And when scientists are stuck at work, hobbies can provide a sense of accomplishment. Jennifer thinks what she likes most about Lego blocks is that she can complete them in a relatively short amount of time while she labours on long-term scientific projects.

Pastimes also lead to inspiration. When astronomers first caught a glimpse of the Moon through a telescope, Galileo quickly realized that the shadows on its face indicated that its surface was rough and mountainous- not smooth. That's because Galileo liked painting, and had learnt how to represent 3D objects on a flat canvas (画布).

Due to the benefits of hobbies, they should be valued in the culture of science. Success in science and having a life don't conflict. Scientists' contribution depends more on the quality—not the quantity—of their work. And really, that is a way of living that is focused on creativity and innovation and not on just producing more.

The capabilities and arrival of virtual reality headsets have become mainstream and available to most people. Virtual reality has now become an extremely useful tool for education, careers, and just for fun.

VR has helped make improvement in the professions that put people in danger. For example, it enables firefighters to learn and experience things that they would only have learned if they were actually in a real fire situation. VR allows people like firefighters and even doctors to participate in a similar environment that they would be working in and make mistakes. By allowing them to make mistakes without serious consequences and learn from those mistakes, a trainee can more quickly catch up in their field.

Many schools have also started to use VR to help young kids with their learning. For example, for language learners, the practice is very helpful in the process of learning. With VR, students who are learning Chinese can visit historical locations like Pingyao or Qufu in a virtual world and be immersed in Chinese culture. They would quickly pick up the language. And they will be more likely to remember and make a connection with what they learned by visiting the places as opposed to just simply reading about those places in textbook.

Not only does VR help people train and practice for professional careers but it can also help people psychologically. For instance, if someone feels very uncomfortable or anxious when they are in small or enclosed places, VR can put them in a similar situation and slowly get the person used to being in such an environment. Or instead of practicing in front of your mom in the kitchen, you can instead practice in an environment made to look like an office and talk to either a real person that isn't your mom or an AI that's programmed to ask you interview questions.

Although many people use VR mostly for fun like video games. I think businesses, schools, and medical practices should make use of VR in their establishments. This is because the benefits of being immersed in an environment and being able to make mistakes, make memorable learning connections, and helping people conquer their anxieties can go a long way in helping society become better as a whole.

But evidence suggests that hobbies such as Kelly's satisfy more than just the stomach. Research has linked participation in leisure activities to many measures of physical and mental well-being, from reduced blood pressure to a sense of belonging. We need to see hobbies and work as win-win games.

Carving out free time can be challenging, but there are strategies for success. Jingmei Li, a cancer researcher from Singapore, uses most of her holiday time for driving trips. Jennifer Hertzberg, a psychologist at the University of California, tries to keep the weekends free for her hobby, building Legos.

Many scientists like them have found that hobbies offer them a break from the stress of doing science. Everyone—including scientists—can get stuck in ways of thinking that prevent them from finding a solution to a problem, no matter how hard they work. Evidence suggests that taking a break or doing something different can help improve problem-solving, by revealing a new approach or an overlooked detail. And when scientists are stuck at work, hobbies can provide a sense of accomplishment. Jennifer thinks what she likes most about Lego blocks is that she can complete them in a relatively short amount of time while she labours on long-term scientific projects.

Pastimes also lead to inspiration. When astronomers first caught a glimpse of the Moon through a telescope, Galileo quickly realized that the shadows on its face indicated that its surface was rough and mountainous—not smooth. That's because Galileo liked painting, and had learnt how to represent 3D objects on a flat canvas (画布) .

Due to the benefits of hobbies, they should be valued in the culture of science. Success in science and having a life don't conflict. Scientists' contribution depends more on the quality—not the quantity—of their work. And really, that is a way of living that is focused on creativity and innovation and not on just producing more.
