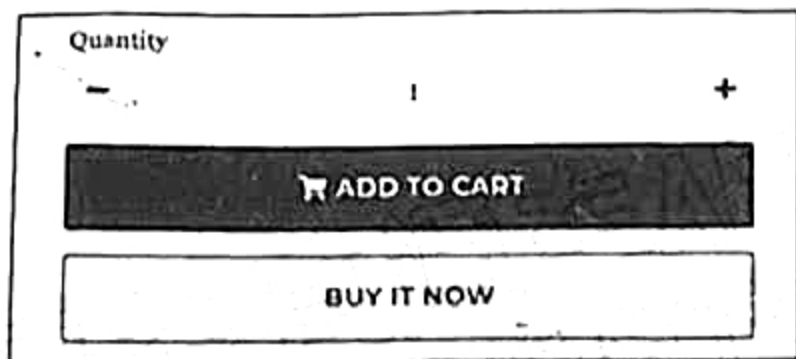

THE HAGUE, Netherlands—A 17-year-old Bangladeshi boy won the International Children's Peace Prize on Friday for his work fighting cyber-bullying (网络霸凌) in his country, and he promised to keep fighting online abuse until it is completely wiped out.

"The fight against cyber-bullying is like a war, and in this war I am a warrior (斗士)," Sadat Rahman said after he was handed the award at a ceremony in The Hague. "If everybody keeps supporting me, then together we will win this battle against cyber-bullying."

Rahman developed a mobile phone app that provides education about online bullying and a way to report cases after he heard the story of a 15-year-old girl who took her own life as a result of cyber-bullying. "I will not stop until we receive no more cases through the app," he said on Friday.

The award is accompanied by a fund of 100,000 euros (\$118,225), which is invested by the KidsRights Foundation in projects that are closely linked to the winner's work.

Previous high-profile winners of the prize who attracted wide attention include Pakistani human rights advocate Malala Yousafzai, Swedish climate activist Greta Thunberg and the students who organized the March For Our Lives after the deadly mass shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida.

After Yousafzai won the International Children's Peace Prize in 2013, she went on to be awarded the Nobel Peace Prize a year later for campaigning for girls to have a universal right to education even after she survived being shot by Taliban militants (激进份子).

Addressing Friday's award ceremony via a video link, Yousafzai praised Rahman's work for contributing to Internet safety.

"All children have the right to be protected from violence no matter if it is physical or mental, offline or online," she said. "Cyber-bullying is robbing children of that right."

A company in Finland has developed a satellite made of wood that it plans to send into orbit this year. The small, experimental satellite aims to test the effectiveness of wooden materials used in the extreme conditions of space.

To carry out the project, several Finnish businesses, including an engineering company, a maker of research satellites and a major wood producer have joined hands. The European Space Agency is supporting the project by assisting with pre-flight testing and providing sensors to be placed inside the satellite.

The wooden satellite developed in Finland, called WISA Woodsat, is a cube (立方体) measuring 10 centimeters on all sides. The main structure of the satellite is completely made of wood. It was built by Arctic Astronautics, a company that also produces and sells CubeSats for educational purposes.

Jari Makinen is the founder of Arctic Astronautics and is leading the project. He said the

Giuseppe Paterno, 96, has faced many tests in life—childhood poverty, war and, more recently, the corona-virus pandemic. Now he has 41 an exam, making him Italy's oldest university graduate.

This week, the 43 railway worker stepped 44 to receive his graduation 45. When asked what it felt like to be graduating so late, "In terms of 46, I'm by far senior to all the others but I didn't do it for winning honor," he said.

He was already in his 90s when he registered for a(n) 47 in History and Philosophy at the University of Palermo. "I understood that it was 48 late but I said to myself 'let's see if I can do it'." On Wednesday, he graduated first in his class with top honors, 49 congratulations from the university president Fabrizio Micari.

Growing up in a poor family in Sicily in the years before the Great Depression, Paterno received only 50 schooling as a child. He 51 in the navy during World War II, worked in the railways 52, married and brought up two children. In a society 53 rebuilding after the war, work and family were the 54, but Paterno never ever 55 his long held dream of 56 education.

As for what he planned to do next, he said he was not about to stop though he had 57. "My project for the future is to 58 myself to writing; I want to revisit all the 59 I didn't have a chance to 60 further. This is my goal."

Two giant pandas recently landed on their homeland in southwest China after their stay at

a Canadian zoo. They returned a lot earlier 61 planned, as the COVID-19 outbreak caused a serious 62 (short) of their bamboo supply.

"Da Mao" and "Fu Shun", 63 flight arrived in Chengdu, capital of Sichuan Province, on Sunday morning, have been sent to Chongqing for quarantine (隔离), according to the Chengdu Research Base of Giant Panda Breeding.

Canada's Calgary Zoo, from which the pair were returned, and COVID-19 travel restrictions made 64 difficult to transport bamboo to feed the pandas. After negotiations, the Canadian and Chinese sides agreed 65 (bring) back the black and white stars to China ahead of schedule.

The Chengdu base on Sunday thanked Canada for its support in China's giant panda protection and called on both countries to have 66 (continue) exchanges and cooperation on the protection of 67 (endanger) species.

The two pandas arrived in Canada in 2013 68 part of a 10-year agreement between Canada and China over the animal's protection and research.
