VII. Writing(写作)(共2题;A题满分10分,B题满分20分,计30分)

(A) One possible version:

In 2005 the car was the most popular means of transport in Europe. Similarly, the car remained the most popular means of transport in 2010 and 2015. However, between 2010 and 2015 the number of people preferring the car decreased. In 2005 the second most preferred means of transport was by air, whereas by 2015 it had been replaced by traveling on foot. One might have expected traveling on foot would decrease over the ten years but it actually increased. The preference for public transport decreased between 2005 and 2010. On the other hand, between 2010 and 2015 the preference for public transport actually increased, while the preference for air travel stayed the same.

(B) One possible version:

Every country has its own traditional festivals, some of which have existed for centuries. In my opinion, we should do everything possible to preserve them.

Some people think that in today's high-tech world celebrations of traditional festivals are old-fashioned and irrelevant to our lives. However, events such as the Spring Festival are important, as they bring communities together and make us think about other people.

Another argument against celebrations of traditional festivals is that they're expensive to organize. To some extent, this is true, particularly when there are firework displays. But it's a small price to pay for brightening up our lives with entertainment and color. Moreover, celebrations of the Dragon Boat Festival in our country attract many tourists from abroad.

To conclude, traditional festival celebrations are a source of great pleasure and interest, and they're certainly worth keeping.

写作评分原则:

1. 本题总分为 30 分:(A) 10 分;(B) 20 分。按四个档次给分。

附:各档次的分数范围和要求:

第四档(很好):(A) 9—10 分;(B) 16—20 分

完全完成了试题规定的要求,覆盖所有内容要点,符合英语表达习惯,应用了较多的语法结构和词汇,没有语法和词汇运用错误,具备较强的语言能力,完全达到了预期的写作目的。

第三档(好):(A) 6—8 分;(B) 11—15 分

完成了试题规定的要求,应用的语法结构和词汇能满足题目的要求,符合英语表达习惯,基本没有语法和词汇运用错误,达到了预期的写作目的。

第二档(一般):(A) 3—5 分;(B) 6—10 分

未恰当完成试题规定的要求,漏掉内容要点,未描述清楚主要内容,写了一些无关内容,有语法和词汇运用错误,影响了对写作内容的理解,信息未能清楚地传达给读者。

第一档(差):(A) 1—2 分;(B) 1—5 分

未完成试题规定的要求,明显遗漏主要内容,写了一些无关内容,语法结构单调,词汇项目有限,有较多语法和词汇运用错误,影响对写作内容的理解,信息未能传达给读者。

Dr. Niall Smith, from the Cambridge Think Tank on Diet and Health, says that our children eat too much fatty food. In a two-year study of 900 school children aged eleven to fifteen, Niall and his team found that children ate double the amount of fat recommended by doctors. Hamburgers, chips, chocolate and soft drinks were the biggest problems.

(B) Please listen to the following passage and fill in the blanks according to the passage you hear with one word for each blank. The passage will be read twice.

W: Good afternoon. I'm going to show you around our new central library which only opened last week. The first bit of good news is that we have longer opening hours than the old library. From Tuesday to Saturday we open at 9:30 am and close at 6:00 pm. We're closed on Sunday, of course.

We've moved some things around as we've got more space here. Fiction and reference books are where they always were on the second floor and on the first floor you'll find children's books. Every Saturday morning one of the librarians will read stories there. There's a new section with games and puzzles which can be borrowed.

Music has moved from the first floor to the third floor where it has much more space. You'll also find DVDs there as well as all our computers.
