A year before, as a college student at the Ohio State. I'd set the world's record of 26 feet 8 1/4 inches. Nearly everyone expected me to win.

Then, trying to hide my nervousness, I added, "How are you?" "I'm fine. Something must be eating you. You should be able to qualify with your eyes closed." He said.

He seemed to understand my nervousness, and took pains to reassure me. Finally, seeing that I had calmed down somewhat, he said, "What does it matter if you are not the first in the trials? Tomorrow is what counts." All the tension left my body as the truth of what he said hit me. Confidently I qualified with almost a foot to spare.

Luz broke his own record and pushed me on to a peak performance. The instant I landed from my final jump—the one which set the Olympic record of 26 feet 5 1/6 inches—he was at my side, congratulating me.

Most heroes are not super. They don't appear in comic books, on television, or in movies. They just do what they believe needs to be done to make the world a better place. Bike Batman is one of them.

Bike Batman is a 30-year-old married engineer who lives in Seattle, Washington. He's a cyclist who also buys and sells bikes as a hobby.

About three years ago, he was looking for a bike for his wife. He found one on Craigslist, a website where people list things they want to sell. As he often does, he also looked at Bike Index, a popular website that allows users to register their bikes and post reports when they're taken. The bike, which he was considering purchasing, clearly matched one reported stolen on Bike Index. Then he called the person who claimed to be the bike's owner and arranged to meet him. When the two men met, Bike Batman told the thief, "You've got two options. You can wait until a police officer gets here, or you can just get out of here." You can imagine what the thief did.

After that first success, Bike Batman developed a safer routine. When he sees questionable bike ads on Craigslist, he cross-references the image with bikes reported on Bike Index. Once he has confirmed it with the owner, he will arrange a meet with the thief and call the Seattle police department so that officers can participate in the action. In more than half of the 22 cases in which he has got back and returned bikes, the thieves have been arrested. In one case, Bike Batman even helped a family recover a wide range of prized possessions that suspects had stolen during a home burglary.

His nickname came from a discussion with a police officer who suggested he be called “Robin Hood”. Since he wasn’t exactly stealing from the rich and giving to the poor, “Batman” seemed a better fit. The idea of a superhero punishing criminals is pretty silly to him, but the main reason why he continues his work is to keep up Seattle’s reputation as a friendly city.

Global GDP in 2030 will be 14% higher as a result of AI(Artificial Intelligence), thanks to improving labor productivity and increasing consumer demand, says a report.

The report could increase the enthusiasm of economic policymakers and the public, and show the power of technology in changing not only people's daily lives. but also economic activities. However, history tells us that, while technological advancements have brought us benefits, they have also led to great social disorders, by changing the production and labor structures, and forcing many workers to either adapt to the changes or lose their jobs. In the 18th century, for instance, skilled workers rose up to resist the Industrial Revolution, destroying machinery in the early 19th century. We may not see similar protests today, but history should serve as a warning against the application of AI technology.

While we may gain a lot of benefits from AI, we must work out plans to reduce its negative effect on society, especially for workers. AI can raise productivity and expand GDP. but it can also make non-adaptive workers jobless. In India, some technology personnel have already felt the negative effect of information technology. As technology industries, across the world seek increasing support from automation (自动操作), robotics and big data analysis, some technology workers have already lost their jobs.

In their 2013 research study, Michael Osborne and Carl Frey from Oxford University estimated 47% of the jobs in the United States are "at risk" of being automated in the next 20 years. They said jobs in transportation and office and administrative support are at high risk of being automated And Kaifu Lee recently said that robots could take away about 50% of all jobs from humans in the next decade.

Those estimates may sound sensational and the impact of technological advancements may not be that serious, as they will also create jobs in new industries. However, policymakers should consider how to better embrace the technological wave to bring benefits while taking action to minimize its negative effects. The government therefore needs to work together with business leaders and social organizations, to promote training programs for potentially helpless workers, in order to make them more capable of adapting to the structural changes in industry and jobs markets in the future.

##### The Bold Bus Driver

On a warm morning last summer, California bus driver Tim Watson was about halfway through his daily 15-mile express route from Milpitas to Fremont when an alert from the Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) flashed across his dashboard screen. A child had been kidnapped(绑架) in Milpitas, the message read, and it asked that drivers be on the lookout for the boy.

The victim was described as a three-year-old child in plaid (方格图案的) shorts and red shoes; the suspect, a man in his 20s wearing jeans and a black hooded sweatshirt. Tim felt his stomach drop when he realized that a man with a kid on his hip had boarded the bus just ten minutes earlier. Tim clearly remembered the boy's plaid shorts.

Tim glanced in one of his mirrors and saw the pair sitting in the last seat at the back of the nearly empty bus. Before alerting authorities, he wanted to confirm their identities. Pulling into a McDonald's parking lot, he announced that he needed to look for a lost bag. He moved slowly down the aisle, peering under each seat, until he approached the last row. As

he bent down, Tim avoided eye contact with the man. "I saw the boy's red shoes," says Tim. "But I knew I had to keep cool."

Back behind the wheel, Tim apologized for the delay and pulled the bus onto the highway. Not wanting to arouse suspicion, he waited a few minutes, then radioed the bus dispatcher in his low voice that he had the kidnapping suspect on his bus.

The dispatcher directed Tim to continue to his final stop at the Fremont BART subway station, where police officers would be waiting. "As 'm diving, all I can think about is what I'm going to do if I get there before the police," he says. So, he slowed down, rolling along at 35mph in a 65mph zone.

AS Tim was about to make the last turn into the BART parking lot, he saw from the side mirrors police car pull up behind the bus silently but with red lights flashing, "The bus doesn't have a back window, so the guy had no idea they were there," says Tim.

He stopped the bus and opened the door. In his right side mirror Tim could see four cops waiting for the suspect. As the man got off the bus with the boy, a police officer grabbed the child out of his arms, threw the suspect to the ground, and **hand-cuffed** him behind his back.

The police officers told Tim that about an hour earlier, the man, Alfonso David Edington.,23, had **snatched** the boy from the Milpitas library after he wandered away from his mother.

Tim thought about his own sons. He went back to check that the boy was OK. Tim found him sitting calmly in the front seat of a police car, without a tear in sight. "I just smiled at him," Tim says, "I knew he was safe."

Edington was charged with kidnapping and faced up to 11 years in prison.

A few weeks after the incident, Tim received a certificate of **recognition** from the VTA Board of Directors and the city of Milpitas. Still, Tim is humble about his actions.
