Long Island Rail Road (LIRR) conductor Jerry Savino returned \$9,000 to its rightful owner on a busy day.

LIRR conductor Jerry Savino, 67, was working on a westbound Hempstead train shortly before 7 p.m. Thursday when a train traveler pointed out a large suitcase on an overhead rack (架了). He said there were no other passengers around the suitcase when it was found.

Although Savino didn't look through the case at once, it was partially open, and he saw some documents inside. He took the case—which also contained a wallet, tax records, checkbooks, and the cash in a large bank envelope—to the police on the train.

Around 7:40 p.m., they gave the belongings, which they believed were left on the 5:19 p.m. train to Hempstead, to MTA Police at Jamaica Station. Using the information within the case, MTA officer Thomas Garland found the owner within two hours of the suitcase's discovery on the train.

This Halloween will be Savino's 19th year on the job, and it's the first time that he's ever found so much money left behind on a train. Reuniting the money and its owner, he said, was a joint effort.

"There were two other people on the train with me, a conductor and an engineer, and they're all a part of this. Everybody joined," he said. "It's not just one person, two people, or three people. It's a community effort."

Joseph Martelli, deputy chief of MTA Police, said the steps taken by MTA employees and police were "very well done."

"We tell our passengers, if you see something, just say it directly. And as MTA employees, whether we are conductors, engineers or police, we have the responsibility to do something," he said.

A young girl in China has apologised for “deceiving fans” after trying to join a boy band.

Fu Jiayuan, 13, said she lied about her gender to a popular management company because she was “young and ignorant”. Even though she was only part of YGN Youth Club’s boot camp(训练营) and not an official band member, fans could watch her training videos on social media.

Many YGN Youth Club fans were amused by the fact, and said it was “not a big deal.” But Ms. Fu, who was forced to admit the deception after an Internet user pointed out that she is a girl, said she would now quit the entertainment industry.

YGN Youth Club only recruits(招募) young boys, most aged between 11 and 13. A challenging programme trains them in singing and dancing techniques and shapes them into future idols.

The company said the mistake happened because auditions(试镜) had been held online due to the pandemic. “Our staff were neglectful in the work process... In the future, we will stick strictly to the company’s rules and regulations,” it said in a statement.

Many fans have come to Ms. Fu’s defence, however, and jokingly compared her to the Chinese folk heroine Mulan. According to legend, Mulan was a young woman who disguised herself as a man so that she could fight to save her family and country. “The look of idol groups is so confusing these days, so it’s hard to tell. Just let her join,” read a popular comment on Weibo.

Boot camps like YGN Youth Club’s are widely popular because families see it as a chance for their children to become rich and famous. But the management companies behind young bands have sometimes been criticised for taking advantage of young children for commercial gain.

In recent months, China says it is time to ban what the national broadcaster describes as “girlish” styles and “vulgar(粗俗的) influencers” in programmes.

Green time that indicates the positive effects of time spent in nature may be the medicine to screen time for children’s brains, improving their school performance, mental health and well-being, research suggests.

A review of existing research has found evidence that green time could reduce or help lessen the negative effects of time spent on watching TV, computers or playing video games.

“Few studies considered screen time and green time together, and possible mental effects on each other.” said University of Adelaide psychology researcher Tassia Oswald who reviewed all the published studies on the subject from the English-speaking world.

“However, there is evidence that green time could reduce consequences of high screen time. Therefore nature may be a wonderful public health resource for youth psychological well-being in a hi-tech era.”

Ms. Oswald is now planning a pilot study with the South Australian Health and Medical Research Institute to further explore the interaction between screen time and green time among young people.

“It’s really hard to reduce young people’s screen time. Technology is here to stay and it’s really important in a lot of aspects of life,” she said. “So it would be great to work out how we can relieve some of the psychological influences of that. As green time would be great, we need to look into it further to strongly support that idea.”

Ms. Oswald said there was a growing trend towards prescribing(开药方) time in nature for health benefits. She said some doctors in the US and the UK offered “green prescriptions”, while



“forest bathing” was popular in Japan.

However, the question of what made up quality green time was still up for discussion, she said. Research suggests the answer depends on the age of the child. For preschoolers, a private garden is important. Primary school aged children need a larger place to play and for teenagers, the nature of the neighbourhood is important.

### Text 10

Ignore what is unimportant and write in phrases, not complete sentences. Second, leave spaces and lines between main ideas. You may want to add some information later. I find that some of you are very good at making use of color, mapping web, and symbols such as arrows, circles and boxes. I highly recommend these tools to all of you, because the use of them makes the outline more easily readable and interesting than the blocks of text. It also makes sure that important words stand out. Here are some examples.
